BHC TRAVELS TO SARATOGA SPRINGS | TRIP ITINERARY

DAY 1

Depart from your hometown and travel to Lake George, which is nicknamed the Queen of American Lakes. Lake George is located within the upper region of the Great Appalachian Valley and drains all the way northward into Lake Champlain and the St. Lawrence Seaway. Enjoy a welcome reception upon check-in. This evening you will enjoy a delicious dinner, followed by a relaxing evening.

DAY 2

This morning you will enjoy a full Adirondack breakfast buffet at your hotel. After breakfast, enjoy a 2-hour sightseeing cruise on the lake aboard the Lac du St. Sacrement. Experience the lake's best views from the upper decks of the Flagship, Lac du St. Sacrement. You will be cruising north past the Lake George Club to Bolton Landing where you will see the stately Sagamore Hotel, Sea Island Camp Site, Islands with private homes and Dome Island, a wildlife refuge. As you head back, be sure to look for Speaker Heck Island where bald eagles have nested for many years. Following your cruise, enjoy lunch on your own in Lake George. Afterwards, you will meet your guide for a tour of Saratoga Springs. The name reflects the presence of Mineral Springs in the area which has made Saratoga a popular resort and destination for over 200 years. Drive past the famous Saratoga Race Track. Later visit the downtown Broadway, the Historic District which consists of important public and private buildings and also, North Broadway, a residential neighborhood with many large Victorian homes. Following your tour, return back to your hotel in Lake George where you will enjoy dinner in the area.

DAY 3

Following your full buffet breakfast, depart for a tour of Fort Ticonderoga, a large 18th-century star fort built by the French at a narrows near the south end of Lake Champlain. The capture of Fort Ticonderoga was the first offensive victory for American forces in the Revolutionary War. It secured the strategic passageway north to Canada and netted the patriots an important cache of artillery. Explore one of North America's finest collection of 18th-century military material culture. Exhibitions featuring art, weapons, and equipment from North America to Europe highlight Ticonderoga's signature stories and document warfare in Colonial and Revolutionary America and the broader Atlantic world. After your visit, depart for Lake Placid for a tour of the town that hosted the 1932 and 1980 Winter Olympics. Your tour will be complete with a trip to the Olympic Village and Ski Jump. Also, you will visit the Ice Rink, featuring the "Miracle on Ice", which refers to the medal round game, during the Men's Ice Hockey Tournament, in the 1980 Olympics, where the United States beat the unbeaten Soviet hockey team for a gold medal. Following your visit, return back to Lake George in the mid afternoon, to prepare for a special evening of dinner and entertainment.

DAY 4

Enjoy another full Adirondacks breakfast buffet at your hotel and then check-out and meet your guide for a tour of the Village of Lake George. You will see the Delaware and Hudson Passenger Station, Lake George Battlefield Parks Historic District, old Warren County Courthouse Complex and the St. James Episcopal Church and United States Post Office, which are all listed on a National Register of Historic Places. Take a ride up to Prospect Mountain, an iconic Lake George landmark, and stop at three scenic overlooks to view the lake from different vantage points. Enjoy lunch on your own in Lake George Village before departing for home with fond memories of your Lake George Adventure in the Adirondack Mountains.
