Tucked in the Oley Valley are hundreds of examples of the standard Pennsylvania barn that evolved from early log and stone Sweitzer barns, or flat barns, and English Lake District bank barns. Built in the late 1700s and early-to-mid 1800s, these barns are examples that were influenced by the cultures of the area's German and English settlers. This specific era, which has been called Pennsylvania's golden age of agriculture, saw the erection of a multitude of barns. With the abundance of forest resources that yielded large trees, the construction types were mostly one-level ground barns and banked barns often with dug-out basements. Even with the disappearance of mature trees, barn builders and farmers persevered with erecting barns.

Participants must have the ability to get in and out of their vehicle repeatedly, climb steps and walk short distances.

Similar to our Spring 2022 tour, no lunch or bus transportation will be provided. Due to COVID related restrictions, this tour is a guided driving tour. The cost of the tour is per person. However, carpooling is encouraged. Registration is limited to the first 12 vehicles that sign up.
