NOVA SCOTIA, CANADA FEATURING PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND | TRIP ITINERARY

This sample itinerary described below is approximately like the itinerary your group will be following during your stay with the Berks History Center and WHITE STAR TOURS, however exact times, days and destinations may vary.

- DAY 1 Depart from Reading and travel to Bangor, ME. Lunch will be on-your-own enroute to checking into the hotel, and dinner (included) will be at a local restaurant.
- After breakfast and checking out of the hotel, travel to Acadia National Park for a tour, then continue to Saint John (lunch on-your-own enroute), the largest city in the province of New Brunswick. After checking into our hotel, dinner (included) will be at a local restaurant.
- PAY 3 Following breakfast, enjoy a sightseeing tour of Saint John, including the famous Reversing Rapids, a natural phenomenon where the high tides of the Bay of Fundy meet and overpower the St. John River and force it to reverse and flow back upstream. Hopewell Rocks features the world's largest natural "flowerpots," unique sculptures shaped from the 50-foot tides that have pummeled the cliffside throughout time. Then we'll cross the Northumberland Strait on the Confederation Bridge, which connects New Brunswick with Prince Edward Island.
- DAY 4 Today you will learn the history of the capital of Prince Edward Island, Charlottetown, as you stroll the downtown and harbor. Prince Edward Island Preserve Company, with its collection of unusual preserves and teas, will be a special treat. The rest of the day will be spent at the legendary home of Anne of Green Gables! This famous novel and its many sequels was written by island native Lucy Maud Montgomery, and has become an iconic symbol of Prince Edward Island. The home that inspired the Green Gables setting has been carefully maintained in the 1800's style and is staffed with knowledgeable guides. Tonight is the night you'll enjoy an island tradition as you sit down to a lobster dinner to complete your day.
- DAY 5 After breakfast and checking out of the hotel, we will travel to Halifax, Nova Scotia, which has a rich maritime history due to its natural harbor, therefore making it one of the largest in the world. Our sightseeing includes a visit to historic Fairview Lawn Cemetery, the burial place of many Titanic victims. Dinner (included) will be at a local restaurant.
- DAY 6 After a relaxing breakfast at the hotel, we'll journey to Peggy's Cove, a picturesque fishing village, named according to legend after the only survivor of a schooner that ran aground in 1800. The original lighthouse was built in 1868. Afterwards we will travel along Evangeline Trail to Digby to catch the ferry across the Bay of Fundy to Saint John. Tonight's dinner will be on board a ship as we sightsee from the water.
- **DAY 7** After breakfast and checking out of the hotel, travel to southern Maine, with lunch on-your-own enroute, check into your hotel and then eat at a local restaurant (included).
- **DAY 8** Enjoy breakfast, then check out and prepare for your departure home, with lasting memories of new friends and beautiful Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island.
