The Museum of the Moving Image in Queens, NYC, is the country's only museum dedicated to the art, history, technique, and technology of the moving image in all its forms. This museum is located at the former Paramount Studios that was established in 1920. While at the museum, we will screen one of Jack Luden's movies with comments by Historical Review of Berks County Editor and Berks History Center Trustee, Charlie Adams.

Lunch will be on your own in historic Astoria/Long Island City in Queens. This area is especially known for the quality and diversity of its dining options including Greek, Brazilian, Croatian, Colombian, Egyptian, Venezuelan, and Thai. A guide to the neighborhood will be provided.



Flushing Meadows Corona Park is the site of two twentieth century World's Fair, 1939-40 and 1964-65. Tour the Queens Museum's dazzling Panorama of the City of New York, the Neustadt Collection of Tiffany Glass, the Art of Rube Goldberg and other exhibits. Also located in this park is the Unisphere, a work of art conceived and constructed as a theme symbol of the 1964-65 New York World's Fair.
